
BLOODY SUNDAY COMMEMORATION 2020 THE GAA REMEMBERS

CROKE PARK STADIUM SATURDAY NOVEMBER 21ST








Overview Concept & Introduction

In November 1920 the horrific events of Bloody Sunday occurred when a mixed force of police (RIC) and auxiliary police (Auxiliaries) killed 13 spectators and one footballer including three young boys and a 29 year old woman due to get married six days later. Such was the horrific nature of the attack that it is credited with playing a key role at impressing upon British authorities the extent to which conditions in Ireland had deteriorated, now there was an urgent need for an end to hostilities.

At the same time the attack on Croke Park altered Irish and GAA history and made the significance of the pitch, and the GAA itself, to be about more than games.

Fourteen people perished at the hands of Crown Forces at a challenge match between Tipperary (challengers) v Dublin (Leinster champions) at Croke Park on Sunday 21st of November 1920. This was an All Ireland test and a thrilling game was expected. Along with the 13 supporters that lost their lives that Sunday, Tipperary footballer Michael Hogan, who was 24 years of age also died, whom the Hogan Stand was subsequently named.



The centenary commemoration event at Croke Park is due to take place before the Leinster senior football final on the evening of Saturday, November 21. If permitted under restrictions, it will be preceded by a ceremonial 'finishing of the match' involving 'Dublin' and 'Tipperary' teams featuring either available county or club players. The event will feature a special narration that focuses on the memory of each of the 14 lives lost at Croke Park in 1920 with a torch lighting ceremony, a wreath laying and a musical performance by Colm Mac Con Iomaire.




Locations Overview - Hill 16 Quadrant

MC Quadrant Platform - Opening Introduction



Special Guest MC Script & Monologue

The scene will be set when we turn off all the lights and flood lights in the stadium; this will signal the start of the commemoration narrative.

The guest MC will then speak about the 14 people who lost their lives in the resulting carnage and will give details of who they were and bring their character to life. As each victim is read out, a torch in the honour and memory will be simultaneously lit on the hill in the quadrant.

"Sunday, November 21st 1920. Mick Hogan sat in the Tipperary dressingroom tormented by Dublin and nerves and thoughts of Frank Burke. All round him and outside on the banks and stands of Croke Park, the talk was about the British agents killed by the IRA that morning in a set of attacks across the city. The numbers were uncertain."







The Ceremonial Laurel Wreath











Stage Performance Colm Mac Con Iomaire


